Fewer Cases Of Preventable Disease, Report

There were rewer cases of preventable disease in the Los Angeles County Health Department jurisdiction, which includes Torrance, in 1946 than in any year since 1940. This is the highlight of the annual report of the Los Angeles County Health Department filled Tuesday by Dr. Roy O, Gilbert, Los Angeles County Health Department filled Tuesday by Dr. Roy O, Gilbert, Los Angeles County health officer.

In a breakdown of figures from which the annual report was compiled, Torrance comes under the same healthy condition, Dr. Henry C Smiley, Torrance District health officer said Diseases reported in this community in 1945 totaled 190 as against 239 in 1944.

In the top group were chickennox, 31; mumps, 13; scalet fever, 22; venereal disease, 56; whopping cough, 19, and measles, 17. Births led deaths more than 63% with 222 new bables in Torrance Health District for the fiscal year included classes for expectant mothers which were attended by 224 women. 
