It would not in itself estab-lins a procedure for making bus-liness loans, but would amend the state constitution to allow the legislature to enact laws on that subject. Bolt emphasized that in no case would any part of the 3100,000,000 bond issue under the farm and home program be used for business loans. State financing of farm and home purchases for veterains has been approved by the voters five times before, in connection, with bond issues appearing on the ballot in 1922, 1926, 1930, 1934 and 1944. "Bonds, totaling: Sitewowd prolous elections at no cost to the tax payers," Bolt said. "Funds for retirement of the bonds and payment of all ad-ministrative costs are obtained from repayment of veterans' purchase contracts over a 20 year period."

purchase contracts over a 20 year period." Lawrence C. Stevens, State Director of Veterans Affairs, has announced that all available funds for farm and home pur-chases will be exhausted before the end of October, and con-tracts negotiated after that time must be made contingent upon approval of Proposition No. 1. Stevens explained this will cause no delay in veterans ob-taining possession of their prop-erties because escrow proceed-ings would not be completed on these contracts prior to the Nov-ember 5 election in any case.
