Letter Stamped 'Unknown' Hints At Nazi Cruelty

A letter and check for 65 marks, sent by Mrs. Cella Pons to her schoolteacher sister in Berlin in February, 1940, have been returned unclaimed more than six and a half years after being mailed.

Mrs. Pons. of 3794 S. Westermave, owner of a property at 1610 Cabrillo ave., Torrance, was living here when she mailed the letter in answer to an appeal from her sister, Fraulein Estera Gornicka, for money and papers which would enable her to leave

Gornicka, for money and papers which would enable her to leave Germany.

Upon the envelope of the returned letter are five Germannotes stating that Fraulein Gornicka "had moved, could not be found," and that she had left "no forwarding address." Two of the notes were written with pen, the other stamped.

Eventually the letter had been opened by American censors and forwarded intact to Mrs. Pons. It left-Berlin Aug. 30, 1946.

Recently Mrs. Pons was informed by a letter from another sister, Mrs. Viva Fish of Tel Aviv, Palestine, that Fraulein Gornicka had died in a Nazi concentration cemp.

From this letter Mrs. Pons also learned that her mother, father and two brothers, one with wife and children, had been taken from their home in Grod. On, Poland, to a German cohgentration camp, where they were later killed.
