Oldest Resident Recalls Torrance As a Weed-Patch

Life in Torrance for the past 53 years as he watched the city grow from a weed patch to a thriving town is recalled by C. F. Fiesel, 1442 Carson st., who recently celebrated his 79th birthday.

Fiesel has vivid recollections of the early days when Torrance's entire population consisted of the owners of a 60-acre farm located where the elementary and high schools now stand.

He worked on this farm for

one year. The owner, Henry Kureus, paid him a dollar a day for working from 4:30 in the morning until nine at night. He slept in the stable with the horses. One of the first jobs Fiesel remembers is cutting weeds where Carson Street now runs. At that time Torrance Blvd. was a cow-pasture.

Upon arrival here he had only 50 cents, all of which he paid for express charges for his belongings to Torrance. Within a year he had saved 75 dollars and purchased a team of horses and a wagon. He then rented a tract for a farm. With the earnings from his first crop barley, he purchased a farm and within the last 53 years he has purchased and sold some 20 pieces of property.

Fiesel likes to reminisce about the early growth of this area. He was one of the first to view the cess-pool in Wilmington that spouted oil instead of water. First oil well here, he says, was drilled on the old Elymeyer place on Main street. He has watched Columbia Steel start in a small shed and expand to their present plant.

Fiesel built the first stucco house in Torrance. He drove his first automobile in 1919 and has driven ever since without accident. When asked if he still drives he said, "sure, I just got back from Los Angeles."

Father of 11 children, nine of whom are still living in California, Fiesel has 15 grand children and one great grand child. His first wife died 30 years ago. With his second wife he has lived for the past 15 years at the Carson street address. Although both came over from Germany on the "Elbe," they did not meet until some 37 years later in Torrance. Both he and his wife are naturalized citizens.
