For the first time since 1933, the rate of tax delinquency in Los Angeles county is showing an upturn, according to Golden Pollard, deptity tax collector, who is preparing for mailing Nov. 1 the tax bills for the coming fiscal year, 1946-47. More than 800,000 real property bills, the largest number in history of Los Angeles county, are to be due and payable on that date, Pollard said. Pollard stated that for the year recently finished the delinquency precentage was 2.01 as compared with 1.88 in 1944-45. Similarly, the delinquency rate on unsecured personal property, which is handled separately from real property, showed an upsurge for the first time in more than a decade, the 1945-46 percentage being 1.18 as compared with .97 in 1944-45. The peak delinquency of more than 13 percent for both real and personal property taxes was in 1983, he said.
