An average of 12,000 veter-ans file changes of address each month with the Los Angeles Veterans Administration region-al office, according to L. C. Chapman, manager. This number will reach at least 25,000 per month if all vet-erans move from place to place in the same ratio as those with names in VA files. Veteran pop-ulation in the same area, ac-cording to a VA survey. Is placed at 675,000. Of this num-ber 317,709 have individual case folders with the VA, Chapman said.
