In an effort to prevent w ale waste of thousands of sale waste of thousands of un-sold Christmas trees on retail lots in California this year as was experienced during the 1945 Christmas season, State Forester DeWitt Nelson said from his headquarters in Sacramento that public forestry agencies, in co-operation with the California Highway Patrol and the State Department of Agricultures oor-der checking stations, will this year rigidly enforce existing laws pertaining to the cutting and transporting of Christmas trees. hristmas season. Nelson explained that the law requires all persons cutting or transporting trees, whether for commercial purposes or for home use, to have in possession at all times a notarized permit from the land owner from whose proberty the trees were cut in-From the land owner from whose property the trees were cut in dicating that the trees were ob-tained legging and with the pro-mission of the land owner. This permit is necessary both for the individual actually cutting the trees and for those transporting the trees to the market, whe ther cut from private or govern ment-owned lands, Nelson said, and unless truckers can produce a suitable permit showing legal right of possession loads will be detained or even confiscated at one of many checking sta tions to be established by tho State Division of Forestry dur-ing November and December.
