Vets Informed On How To Pay Insurance

The five ways veterans may use their terminal leave bonds as payment on government life insurance were explained today by L. C. Chapman, manager of Los Angeles Veterans Adminis-

Los Angeles Veterans Adminis-tration regional office.

Although VA does not issue terminal leave bonds, Chapman said, be act authorizes the VA to accept the bonds in connec-tion with government insurance.

The Bonds may be used as follows:

ollows:

1. To pay premiums now of surance now in force. 2. To purchase new insurance. 3. To reinstate lapsed insur-

nce.
4. To pay the amount required then converting to permanent

4. To pay the amount required when converting to permanent insurance policies.

5. To repay policy loans made prior to July 31, 1946.

When terminal leave bonds are used for insurance premium payments, Chapman said, any balance above the amount necessary to make the desired payment to the veteran's account will be used for the purpose of future premium payments, Assignment of bonds will not increase a policy's cash value until the bonds have matured. Assignment of bonds for insurance purposes may be made at any VA office. Necessary assignment forms have been received by the Los Angeles regional offices, Chapman explained.
