## Assessed Value Of L.A. County Up 27.8 Percent

Assessed value of taxable property in Los Angeles county increased 27.8 per cent during the war years, amounting to \$3,299,574,610 for the present year, compared with \$2,581,841,644 for 1941-42, California's Taxpayers Association said today, making public its study of valuations, in California counties.

Assessed value of taxable property throughout California increased 23.8 per cent during the war years, this year's valuation amounting to \$0,100,823,858, compared with \$7,350,926,865 for 1941-42.

Biggest percentages increase in valuation was in Solano county, up 54.6 percent, to \$83,155, 640 this year from the \$44,089, 576 value for 1941-42.
