SAN PEDRO UNION LEADER DEMANDS TORRANCE AREA **MARKETS CLOSE ON MONDAYS**

Frank Kresnesky, President of the San Pedro Butcher Union controlling Torrance Area butchers, is demanding that we stop selling you meat on Mondays.

In your interest, responsible retail meat market operators are refusing this dicta-

EMPLOYERS HAVE OFFERED A 5-DAY WORK WEEK WITH INCREASED PAY

During the past year, journeymen butchers have been paid \$60 for a 48 hour work week (\$1.25 per hour)—an 80% increase over hourly rates paid in 1941. In a sincere effort to negotiate a new, workable contract, market operators

have offered \$66 pay for a 5 day, 40 hour work week (\$1.65 per hour) with time and a half (\$2.471/2 per hour) for all hours worked over 40. This is an increase of 32% over wage rates in the expiring contract.
