Nearby Refinery Fire Cause Of \$25,000 Damage

Three explosions and fire Sin-day night destroyed four tanks at the Boninguez plant of the Sheft Oil Co., doing more than \$25,000 damage according to L. R. Goldsmith, plant superithen-dent. The plant is located just east of Torrance. No lives were lost and nohe of the 100 workmen on the job were injured.

No lives were lost and none of the 100 workmen on the job were injured. About 100,000 gallons of gaso-line in three open-top tanks and three storage tanks burned. Cause of the fite has not been determined. But Goldsmith said he believes the blaze was caused by "flashing back of gasoline vapors". The plant will be out of ser-vice for a week. The explosions occurred when the flames reached the three open-top tanks. Observers esti-mated the flames shot upward as high as 300 feet, but Gold-smith doubled that they were higher than 100 feet. The explosions occurred at \$30 p.m. Forty company fir-men using foam had the blaze under control by 11 p.m., and the blaze was extinguished by midnight. The huge spurting flames at-tracted sightseens from the en-ting hardron area. The California highway partoi and deputy sher-ifs blocked off all highways leading to the plant.

Bryant said. "Fildden pay" in the form of free food, clothing, lodging, dental eare and other benefits bring his weekly pay check to the equivalent of about \$40 a week, or a fotal of \$2,080 a year.
