Further Hints On Victory Gardens Given

By Agricultural Extension Service

Following rain, garden celery should be sprayed with Bordeaux mixture at the rate of two ounces (6 level tablespoons) to a gallon of water. Other copper fungicides can be used including yellow copper oxide. Sprays should be repeated about every two weeks.

This spray will control celery blight which causes yellowish brown on the leaves and stems. Bordeaux can be obtained at your garden supply house.

Frequent applications of nitrogen fertilizer will make celery grow much faster. The material can be applied at this time of year in a shallow trench at the side of the irrigation ditch. One cupful of sulphate of ammonia or one and a quarter cupfuls of nitrate of soda, or two-thirds of a cup of ammonium nitrate will be enough for a hundred feet of row. This application should be repeated every two or three weeks.

Sweet Potatoes
If your sweet potato crop is yet in the ground, the rain may start some sprouts or cause the potatoes to begin rotting. Better get them out as quickly as possible and lay them on the ground for a few hours to dry.

When the surface is dry, gently rub and break off the sprouts in order to store for storage. Never wash the dirt off if you intend to store them. Washing will spread diseases. Do not leave them in the field overnight at this time of year—they may be frozen.

Past Control

Aphis are probably developing rapidly on cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower and other similar crops. Treat them with nicotine sulphate dust or spray if you can get it. As a substitute use pyrethrum or some of the other similar materials. DDT is not safe to use in the garden.

Red spider can develop in this cool weather. Watch for them on the under sides of leaves. Dusting with a high grade dusting sulphur will give fair control if days are warm.

OPA Reminds Registration Deadline Near

Landlords now operating under the rent regulation governing hotels, rooming houses and motor courts in Southern California rental area who have not obtained forms for the supplemental registration of their establishments, should do so soon, as the deadline for filing the completed forms is Dec. 31, 1946, Ben C. Koepke, Southland OPA rent director, said today.

All landlords, who rent rooms in a hotel, rooming or boarding house dormitory, residence club, motor court, tourist home, tourist court cabin and those who rent space in an auto camp or trailer camp, are required to file the supplemental data and may get the proper form at their local rent office.

"After getting the forms, landlords should be careful to fill in all the information called for on the form which applies to their establishment," Koepke said. "The forms are not difficult to fill out if the instructions supplied with the forms are followed. However, we will gladly assist any landlord who has any questions about completing the form properly."

"It is important, of course, that they write plainly and sign the form in the lower right hand corner of the initial page. Incomplete, unreadable and unsigned forms will be returned for proper completion."

"Both copies of the form must be submitted to this office, the address of which is stamped at the top of the first page. Landlords need not retain an extra copy because one copy of the registration statement will be returned to them after their establishment has been classified and the classification indicated in the upper right hand corner."

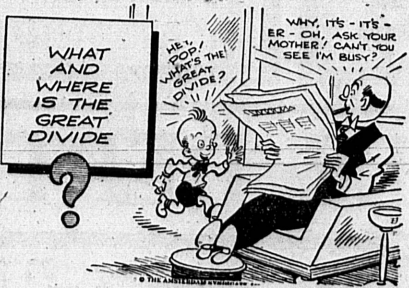
SCHOLARSHIP BANQUET
