Employers Have Offered a 5-Day Work Week With Increased Pay

During the past year the wage rate for journey-man butchers has been \$60 for a 48-hour work week (\$1.25 per hour)—an 80% increase over hourly rates paid in 1941.

insists on the power to say:

In a sincere effort to negotiate a new, workable contract, market operators have offered \$66 pay for a 5-day, 40-hour work week (\$1.65 per hour) with time and a half (\$2.47½ per hour) for all hours worked over 40. This is an increase of 32% over wage rates in the 1945-46 contract which expired last week. Six other Southern California Butchers' Unions (covering Redondo Beach, Inglewood, South Gate, Whittier, Los Angeles and all cities west and north to San Luis Obispo) accepted this offer last month and are now receiving the higher wages and are keeping the meat markets open 6 days a week.
