### Foodless Bars Subject To Check By State Board

All licensed on-sale premises in Southern California, required to operate as bona fide cafes, are being carefully inspected and checked to make certain they are complying with the recent state Supreme Court decision upholding the Board of Equalization's contention such premises must be genuine cafes.

A comprehensive questionnaire covering every phase of cafe operation has been prepared by the Board, and is filled out on the premises by the liquor control officers charged with the inspection, it was announced.

"Kitchen, dining room and bar equipment, supplies and employees are carefully checked with particular attention being given to food supplies, its condition and facilities for preparing and serving it," the board said. "We are learning such details as the number of knives, forks and spoons on hand, whether the cooking equipment shows regular use, and the amount of the monthly fuel bill."

"Where any deficiency is found, the license is warned by the inspector and given a brief time to correct it. Failure to do so will cause the Board to take steps to revoke or suspend the license."

### Residents Here To Benefit From Airways Move

Airline service took on new meaning and convenience to Torrance and Long Beach residents this week as Southwest Airways, only government-authorized feeder air carrier in the state, and four other lines, moved their operations bases from Burbank to the new Los Angeles Municipal airport near Inglewood.

The Southwest system alone places a network of ten California cities—soon to be increased to 23 points—within 8 easy driving miles of downtown Torrance. Other airlines afford direct service or connections to some 400 other points throughout the nation.

Transfer of airline operations to the new field also assures overnight air mail and air express service to virtually any city in the United States.

Southwest Airways is affording a new type of airline service, designed primarily to meet the air transportation needs of smaller cities. As one of the nation's six presently operating feeder airlines, Southwest has Los Angeles to San Francisco, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Santa Maria, San Luis Obispo, Coalinga, Monterey and Santa Cruz-Watsonville.

In January it will open additional routes from San Francisco to Redding, via the Sacramento Valley, and from San Francisco to Eureka and the Redwood Empire.

### Only Third Of Eligible Vets Apply For Pay

Only one-third of the veterans eligible for unused leave pay have filed applications, advised the Veterans Service Center. Ex-GIs were urged to file immediately in order to take advantage of the free notary services and expert advice at the Third and Broadway center.

The first rush of applications has brought approximately 300,000 pay forms to the local Army Finance office, with an estimated 650,000 veterans still eligible to file.

The importance of getting special advice on completing the form was stressed by Robert H. Craig, Center president, who pointed to the estimate of the Navy office at Great Lakes that nearly 30 percent of the applications had to be returned due to improper completion of the form.

On the other hand, out of 6,000 forms checked by one notary at the Center, only two had errors returned with errors. Over 16,000 veterans have completed unused leave pay forms at the Veterans Service center, with an estimated saving of \$8,000.

All enlisted personnel of the military services are entitled to receive up to 120 days of unused leave at the rating they held on leaving the service. Applications can also be completed at any of the 18 affiliated veterans centers in Bell, Beverly Hills, Compton, Culver City, East Los Angeles, Hollywood, Highland Park-Eagle Rock, Huntington Park, Inglewood, Monterey Park, North Hollywood, San Fernando, San Pedro-Wilmington, Santa Monica, South Gate, Sunland-Tujunga, Torrance and Van Nuys.

### Four Persons Injured In Car Mishap Here

Four persons Sunday were injured, two critically, in a three-car collision on Normandie ave. near 208th st. The critically injured were Raymond Warnick, 35, proprietor of the Central garage, Torrance, driver of a jeep, and his wife, Mrs. Mary Warnick, 34, who were removed to the Torrance Memorial hospital.

Warnick suffered severe head and back injuries, and his wife sustained a possible fractured vertebra, three fractured ribs and shock, doctors said.

Driver of the second car, Lester Free, 23, Long Beach, and the operator of the third vehicle, Charles Posner, 37, Los Angeles, were taken to the San Pedro hospital for treatment of minor injuries.

According to officers the jeep, after colliding with Free's auto, bounced back into the car driven by Posner.

William A. Smith, chairman: Flood Control district, Assessor, Registrar of Voters, Health Department, Garbage, Disposal districts, Pound department, Agricultural Commissioner, Farm Advisor, Livestock Inspector, Justices of the Peace.

Leonard J. Roach, chairman: County Counsel, Treasurer and Tax Collector, Courts Municipal and Superior; Purchasing and Stores; Parks and Recreation department, Marshal's office, Psychopathic department, Public Defender, Auditor and County Clerk.

John Anson Ford, chairman: Superintendent of Schools, Janitors, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Committee of Inter-racial Progress, Public Library, Telephone Department, Civil Service, Public Welfare Commission, Civic Center Committee, Forester and Fire Warden, Grand Jury.

Raymond V. Darby, chairman: Board of Supervisors, Coroner, Public Administrator, Sanitation Districts, County and City Affairs Committee, Patriotic Hall, Soldier Burials, Law Library.

Roger W. Jessup, chairman: Recorder, Building and Safety Department, Mechanical, Regional Planning Commission, Road Department, Surveyor and Engineer, District Attorney, History, Science and Art Department, and Youth Committee.

### Special Highway Legislative Session Called

Governor Earl Warren will call a special session of the State Legislature "early in January" to provide the solons with an opportunity to "give undivided attention" to the highway and traffic safety problem in California.

The Governor's announcement was made during a meeting of the joint legislative fact-finding committee on highways, streets and bridges headed by Sen. Randolph Collier of Yreka at Sacramento last week.

Pointing out that 4,000 persons are dying every year on California highways and streets, Governor Warren declared that delay in dealing with the problem "would be putting a premium on death" as well as on injuries from accidents, congestion in cities and inconvenience.

The Collier Committee filed its report with the Governor calling for a 12-year program which will modernize the state, county and city highway systems of California at a gross cost of \$2,434,730,000 in addition to expenditures already planned during the next two years.

### County Buys 790 Feet Of Beach In Torrance

County supervisors Monday purchased 790 feet of beach frontage in the Hollywood Riviera section of Torrance for \$50,000.

Located south of the Hollywood Riviera club, the property was owned by the Huntington Heights and Redondo Co.

The supervisors also approved the purchase of an additional 1550 feet of frontage in the city of Redondo Beach at a price of \$73,470.

All of the acquired shoreline property is unimproved.
