Prior to May 21, 1946, the one percent employees tax also went into the Unemployment Insurance fund, but now only the employers' tax supports that fund.

Employers subject to the California Unemployment Insufficie act are those thiring one or more employees. Exempt from the tax are the services of agricultural workers, domestic servants in private homes, governmental employees, persons employed by certain non-profit institutions and by certain relatives; and railroad workers.

California employers of eight or more persons are also subject to the Federal Unemployment Tax act. The federal tax is three percent of the first \$3,000 of annual wages, but contributions to the state are credited, leaving an actual payment to the Federal government to the Federal government of three-teeths of one percent.
