Harry Thayer, general manager, announced today that the Los Angeles Dons have signed Bob Kelly, Notre Dame and Navy all-American.

The addition of Kelly is considered by Head Coach Dud De Groot as one of the most important acquisitions the Dons have made to date.

The 21-year-old all-American, a product, of Chicago's high schools, starred at right half-back for Notre Dame in 1943 and 44, received his all-American honors at the conclusion of the latter season, entering the Naval Academy in 1945.

Kelly is a youngster by professional standards, being 21 years old. He stands five feet ten, weighs 188 pounds.
