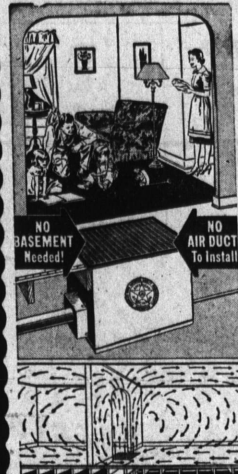

Council Agrees To Sponsorship Of Vets' Emergency Housing Program

Torrance City Council Tuesday night signed an agreement with the Veterans Emergency Housing, Inc., and the Federal Public Housing Administration, for sponsorship of emergency housing at Lomita flight strip. The City required that the veterans group agree to accumulate some \$5,000 necessary for demolition of the buildings at the end of the housing emergency, and made it clear that the city is obligated in no way except for sponsorship, as required by F.P.H.A.

J. G. Caldwell, veterans service director and leader of the Veterans Emergency Housing, Inc., said that the group has available 39 buildings and 36 acres of land at the airport.

When asked by Mayor J. Hugh Sherkey Jr. about the California National Guard program for use of some five acres and several buildings as headquarters for the 578th Engineer Combat Battalion, Caldwell said that whoever has first priority will govern that problem. Sherkey indicated that he desired that the city keep its promise to the National Guard while at the same time aiding the veterans group. Councilman G. V. Powell, however, took the attitude that the National Guard has enough money to deal with its housing problem.

Asked about procedure to be followed, Caldwell said the plan now goes to the San Francisco National Housing office, then to Washington for final approval. He said the buildings had been released by the W.A.A. to National Housing and that the land will be rented on a \$2 to \$3 per unit per year basis from F.P.H.A. He said he did not know how F.P.H.A. will get custody of the land which is involved not only with Torrance Municipal Airport plans but also with National Guard program. It has been in custody of the U. S. Engineers.

Under the priority system adopted by the War department, the armed forces, of which the National Guard is a part, has first priority on such surplus property; next Federal agencies, then states and fourth counties. Fifth come cities and then private firms or individuals.

The Veterans Emergency Housing, Inc., is a private corporation. The armed forces, except for the National Guard, have indicated no interest in any of the airport property. Likewise have other federal agencies, the State of California and the County of Los Angeles.
