Wide Range In School Taxes, **Report Shows**

Of Los Angeles County's 105 elementary school districts. five levied property tax rates ranging between 20 cents and 45 eents per \$100 of assessed valuation, 80 levied rates ranging between 45 cents and \$1.50, and five levied rates higher than \$1.50, California Taxpayers' association said today, making public its study of elementary school tax rates in California counties. Fiscal 1945-46 is the latest year for which complete statewide data are available.

Of the state's 2,238 elementary school districts, 50 levied between 20 cents and 36 cents, 1,134 between 45 cents and 90 cents, 54 between 90 cents and \$1.50, and 45 levied \$1.50 or more per \$100 of assessed value.

Districts which levied less Districts wince review less than a 20-cent rate were not eligible to share in the state's equalization fund this year, the Taxpayers' association said, pointing out that every district received the state's basic apportionment of approximately \$66 per pupil.

legislature provides that a Legislation currently before the legislature provides that a district must levy a rate of at least 45 cents before it can share in the equalization fund which is part of the \$120 per pupil in average daily attendance state school fund made mandatory by the passage of Proposition No. 3 by the voters in November, 1948. The constitutional amendment provided that each district receive at least \$90 per pupil regardless of tax rate levied.

Maximum elementary school tax rate for current expense, without approval by the voters, is 90 cents for districts with kindergarten and 80 cents without kindergarten.
