### Suicide Attempt Thwarted By Two Torrance Police

Edgar Leo Finley, 59, of Lennox, was taken to Harbor General hospital early Monday morning after two Torrance policemen had thwarted his attempt at suicide.

Captain Schumacher and Officer Johnson discovered Finley's car parked in some bushes on Catalina st. near the Palos Verdes line with the motor running and a hose running from the exhaust into the closed car.

The police officers reported that Finley was almost overcome by the fumes when he was found, but was revived at the hospital and declared out of danger.

The officers also said that suicide notes found in the car indicated family trouble as the reason for the attempted self slaying.

joint control will be worked out by the committee which is to report its findings in two weeks.

Forrest Murdock, president of the college, said that Carl Arfwedson, college business manager, and General Wayne Allen, chief county administrative officer, will confer on the details this week, and that his board will meet tonight on the matter.

Murdock told the Torrance Herald that he did not believe the college can spend money on land not its own. He expressed the hope, however, that the entire 45 acres can be given, to permit the district to construct the college and athletic plant. Then he said that the district could lease for 99 years the use of the athletic plant by the county and the public at large.

Murdock said that plans are being completed to open the college doors on the park with an enrollment of 1000 students by Sept. 15.

He said that the overall college development plan is a 10 to 15 year program.

Murdock complimented the Torrance Herald for its work in stirring up the protest which resulted in the supervisors action in deciding to lower its price or "give" the needed land to the district.

vided, the fishing fleet may be lost completely to Los Angeles harbor.

Another proposal, indeed a demand, has been adequate hospital and emergency ambulance facilities. CIO unions have records of scores of injured workers lying for hours on the docks unattended, waiting for ambulances. Some have died, tragic testimony to the failure of a great city to provide even meager facilities for its working people.

Because these and similar proposals backed by labor, industry, business and civic leaders alike went unheeded by the Harbor department, CIO joined with other San Pedro groups in proposing to Mayor Bowron that men, experienced in harbor problems and with proven interest in building a great port, be named to fill vacancies on the Harbor board.

Serving as boys' vice principal at Torrance high school for the rest of this semester is Duncan Powers. Powers replaces Bernard Donahue, who has been transferred to Banning high school.

Powers comes to Torrance from Mt. Vernon Junior High, where he was chairman of the physical education department. He has been at several different Los Angeles schools teaching physical, education and some french and journalism.

A graduate of the University of Southern California, Powers served as a colonel in the Air Force during the war.

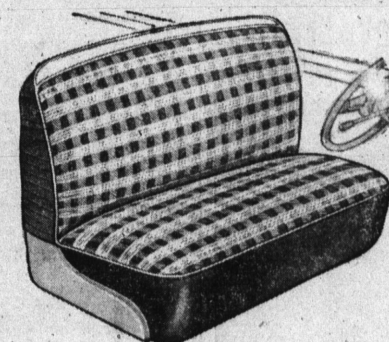

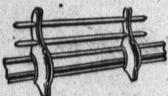
