King Introduces Amendment For Rules Of House

Charging that a majority decision by the Supreme Court upholding the conviction of George Harris has struck a serious blow at the civil rights of the American people, Rep. Cecil King of the 17th District has introduced a resolution amending the rules of the House to insure that 'a man's home is his castle.'

He indicated that the court's decision threatened the guarantees of the Constitution against unlawful searches and seizures.

In the case of Harris, two FBI agents had obtained warrants for his arrest on charges of violating the mail fraud statute, suspecting Harris of being involved in a scheme to defraud an oil company by negotiating and cashing a bogus check of \$25,000.

Entering Harris' home, the agents handcuffed him and carried out a systematic five-hour search of his rooms.

Unable to find any evidence implicating Harris as a forger, the agents did discover 11 draft registration certificates and eight notices of draft classification.

Harris was brought to trial and convicted on charges of unlawful possession, concealment and alteration of cards and certificates. This conviction was upheld by a 5-4 decision of the Supreme Court.

'Gone with the whip of a pen is the immunity guaranteed the American people under the fourth amendment of the Constitution against unlawful searches and seizures,' King told the House in introducing his resolution.

The principle that 'a man's home is his castle' is a heritage from common law and forms the basis for the Constitution's fourth amendment.

King's resolution would specifically impose the following duty: 1.—Examining from time to time the decisions of the Supreme Court of the United States to determine whether any such decision infringes upon any right guaranteed to the people by the Constitution or any of its amendments.

2.—Reporting to the House at least once a year the results of such examinations.

3.—Recommending to the House, from time to time, such proposals for legislation or amendments to the Constitution as it deems necessary to protect such fundamental rights of the people of the United States.

4.—Examining from time to time the decisions of the Supreme Court of the United States to determine whether any such decision infringes upon any right guaranteed to the people by the Constitution or any of its amendments.
