

Mormon Chorist To Direct L.A. Group Sunday

J. Spencer Cornwall, director of the world-renowned Mormon Tabernacle choir, Salt Lake City, will direct an Adult Choir Festival to be presented next Sunday afternoon (May 25) at the First Methodist church, 8th and Hope streets, in downtown Los Angeles.

Scheduled for 4 p. m. and open to the public, the festival is being sponsored jointly by the Choral Conductors Guild and the music department of the Church Federation of Los Angeles as part of a community-wide program to raise the standards of church music. More than 1700 singers from 58 church choirs throughout the community will participate in Sunday's event.

Cornwall, as director of the Mormon Tabernacle choir, has gained national recognition because of the choir's weekly broadcasts each Sunday. He has set a standard for many other choirs and musical organizations to follow.
