The 64th session of the California Conference (Ev.) of the Evangelical United Brethren church closed in Anaheim Sunday evening in a Youth service directed by Rev. J. E. Brecheisen of San Francisco. Dr. A. H. Douscher of Dayton, Ohio, was the speaker.
Appointments to the various charges were read on Saturday afternoon by the presiding bishop, C. H. Stauffer of Kansas City. Rev. H. Wesley Roloff, pastor of the local church, was assigned to the Torrance church for the eighth consecutive year.
Several ministers were received into the California Conference. Dr. Alvin S. Haag was received from the New York conference and was stationed as professor of philosophy at Redlands University. Rev. Leonard Wendland, former chaplain in the United States armed forces, was appointed to serve the Roger Young Village Protestant church. This service is being rendered as a cooperative protestant venture in conjunction with the churches of the Church Federation of Los Angeles. Rev. Mr. Davis, also a former chaplain, was assigned as an associate of Rev. Joe Ryan of the Melrose Avenue church. Rev. Philip R. Seifridge of Stockton was received into the Conference and appointed to serve the church at Anaheim.
Rev. Mr. Roloff was honored by the conference in his election and appointment to several important offices. He was elected for a four-year term to fill the position of executive secretary of evangelism of the California Conference.
Rev. and Mrs. Roloff hope to leave soon on their vacation trip, which may include visits with relatives in Oregon, Kansas, Minnesota and Iowa. The Roloffs expect to take this trip in connection with the Rev. Mr. Roloff's attendance at the Training and Planning Conference to be held on Lake Erie, at Vermillion, Ohio.



Veterans May Get Army Barracks At Local Airfield
Whether or not veterans will occupy abandoned army barracks buildings at Torrance Municipal Airport will be decided within a few days. Representative Cecil R. King requested that the building numbers of the 29 units be sent at once to FPHA, Washington.
In a telegram to J. G. Caldwell, representing a group of ex-servicemen known as Veterans Emergency Rentals Inc., King announced that the War Assets Administration had told him it expects to be able to turn the barracks over to the Federal Public Housing Authority by June 15.
Caldwell said the move practically assured the veterans possession of the buildings, since Stanley Abel, Southern California director for FPHA, has declared he will turn the 29 units over to them if they come under his jurisdiction.

BEACH RESIDENT KILLED, BROTHER INJURED HERE
Norris Johnston, 26, of 584 36th st., Manhattan Beach, died in Harbor General hospital last week from injuries sustained when the car he was driving struck a light pole.
Police said that Johnston was thrown from the car by the impact. Also injured in the accident was his brother, Howard Johnston, 23, who was treated for minor injuries.

CHOICE OF NEW L.B. SCHOOL HEAD STILL UNDECIDED
Choice of a new superintendent of Long Beach schools is still undecided, according to Board of Education President Eugene Titcher, who said the school trustees are reviewing the qualifications of those being considered for the position.
The present superintendent, Dr. Kenneth E. Overholzer, will end his duties June 30 to assume a similar post in Denver.
Approximately 15 persons have applied for the post.

Oxygen Now Used In Process Of Steel Industry
The technique of using oxygen to stimulate the heart action of a patient undergoing surgery or to speed up the natural healing process of the body during some kinds of illness is now being initiated in the steel industry to promote chemical reaction in the open hearth process of steelmaking and to speed up the production of steel.
Oxygen is one of the commonest of all elements but its progress as a general industrial tool has been comparatively slow as against some other rarer elements. For many years the cost of commercially pure oxygen was a barrier to its increased use. Technical papers on the possibilities of this type of oxygen in steelmaking were presented before the American Iron and Steel Institute at least as early as 1920, when several experts formally discussed this subject.
Several oxygen manufacturing plants which will serve steel plants are now under construction, and it is reported they will produce oxygen of 90 percent purity at about \$7 per ton.
