At this meeting it also was decided that the association will ask members to participate in a summer program for canning foods for the school cafeteria.

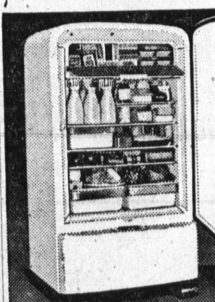
Margaret Svensk, Nicholas V. Leone Marry In South Gate

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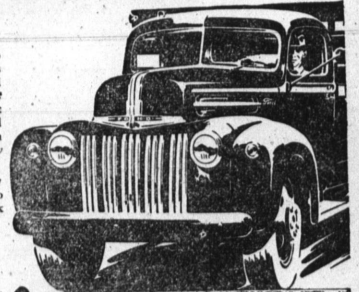
