Botulism Cause Is Explained By

Los Angeles County Health Officer Botulism is caused by a toxin from a rod-shaped, spore-form-ing germ common in garden soil are properly canned, that is, by the pressure method and according to the manufacturer's directions, the germs will be de-stroyed. It is when air is ex-cluded from food containing bo-tulism germs which have not been subjected to this intense heat that these germs grow and form deadly poison. Non acid fruit s, vegetables, flesh foods and some acid foods furnish growth material to the germ. Portions of acid or pickled home-canned foods that extend out of the liquid in which they are packed are also potentially dangerous. All such food should be boild steadily for 15 minutes prior to eating and should one canned and should one of the steat the steat of the steat out of the liquid in which they are packed are also potentially angerous. All such food should be boild steadily for 15 minutes prior to eating as should not contain has been known to they for days after its victim has partaken of contaminated food although its incubation per-iod is generally only a few hours. Symptoms include blurred and double vision, diarrhee, thick speech and difficulty in swail-able for immediate treatment

speech and difficulty in swal-lowing. An antitoxin or serum is avail-able for immediate treatment. Time is the important factor and a few hours delay may be fatal. For those who have eatern the food but have not developed symptoms, smaller doses of the antitoxin should be given. In all instances, the local health officer is to be notified in order that laboratory tests may be made, adequate treatment instituted and any other victims from the same source located.
