Other VA outpatient office's re located in each of the four ub-regional headquarters: Long each, Santa Barbara, Bakerseld, and San Bernardino, and in the three VA hospitals in the os Angeles area: Birmingham A Hospital, Van Nuys, VA, Cener, Sawtelle, and the VA hospital rear San Fernando. Only verans with service connected disbibilities are eligible for VA out-atient treatment.

SOUVENIR FIREARMS

THOSE SOUVENIR FIREARMS
There are five categories of
souvenir firearms brought back
by veterans from overseas which
must be registered at the nearest office, of the Alcohol Tax
Unit, Bureau of Internal Reve-

Dait, Bureau of Internal Revenue.
Registration is required if they it into any of the following groups: (1) Capable of firing more than one shot with one continuous pull of the trigger; (2) Having a barrel less than 18 mehes long; (3) Having a muffer or sileneer; (4) Revolver or istol with accompanying shoulter stock; (5) Any other weapon, from which a shot is discharged by explosive, capable of being concealed on the person.
The Veterans Administration is cooperating with the Treasury bepartment in urging all veterans to comply with this law.
