Mayor J. Hugh Sherfey Jr., of Torrance, this week proclaimed Friday Aug. 1 as Air Force Day in Torrance, in conjunction with a proclamation made by President Truman in honor of those who have served and are serving in the American Air Forces.

The proclamation reads: WHEREAS the President of the United States of America has proclaimed August 1, 1947 as Air Force Day in honor of the millions of men and women, living and dead, whose contribution to the development and growth of American air power have made the Army Air Forces this nation's most formidable and far reaching weapon of defense; and

WHEREAS the Army Air Forces is playing an increasingly important role in world affairs; and WHEREAS our Air Force is maintaining constant research and development of aircraft for the benefit of our nation; and WHEREAS it is recognized that air power has contributed to the preservation of our liberties and way of life, and seems destined to play a major role in insuring an even more glorious future for the peoples of the world; and Now, therefore, I, J. Hugh Sherfey Jr., Mayor of the City of Torrance, in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, do hereby proclaim Friday, August 1, as Air Force Day in Torrance.

I urge all citizens of this city to join in the observance of Air Force Day, the 40th birthday of the Army Air Forces and pay tribute to those who have given so much for us and posterity.

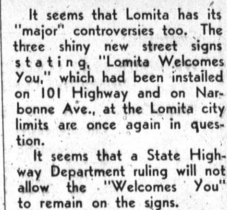
