

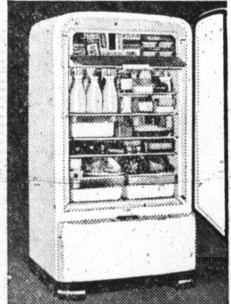
LOS ANGELES VA CONTACT OFFICE HOURS CHANGED

Los Angeles School Budget Up \$12,000,000

The Los Angeles board of education has adopted its final 1947-48 budget, which totals \$72,422,528 exclusive of cafeteria and child care center programs, an increase of \$12,467,069 over last year.

This is the first year that Torrance schools have not been a part of the Los Angeles budget. Torrance City School District was formed this year as a result of the adoption of the City Charter on Aug. 20, 1946. Lomita, Harbor City and Shafter string strip children continue to be involved in the Los Angeles school budget, however.

Harry M. Howell, assistant superintendent in charge of the budget division, announced that \$5,819,881 of the increase is for advancing the salaries of most of the district's 17,000 employees. The sum is \$544,560 over the tentative budget of \$71,877,968.

This increase provides for raising maximum elementary teachers' salaries from \$3660 to \$4090 annually; high school teachers from \$4060 to \$4370, and junior college instructors from \$4510 to \$4650, with an ultimate maximum in future years for all teachers of \$5070.

Tax requirements, said Howell, will be \$26,666,428, a decrease of \$1,974,660 from last year. He estimated the tax rate for city schools, exclusive of bond interest and sinking fund requirements, would be \$1.2721 per \$100 of assessed valuation, as compared to \$1.7287 last year.

The final budget must be presented by Aug. 15 to the board of supervisors, which will set the tax rate on or before Sept. 1.

County Building For July Totals \$15,199,820

The County Building and Safety Department today announced it had issued 3956 permits for an estimated expenditure of \$15,199,820 during the month of July.

Building total for the year to date was raised to \$103,438,614 as compared with \$80,637,881 for the corresponding period of 1947.

July's building total exceeded the July, 1946 cost figure by approximately \$3,300,000 and was \$1,500,000 above the building permit costs for June.

Four amusement places, 13 apartment houses with 45 units, five cabins, three churches, 101 commercial buildings, 16 duplex dwellings, one hotel, 10 factories and 1712 one family homes were among the building items listed.

13 Million To L.A. County Vets For Farms, Homes

State assistance totaling \$13,564,432.20 has been extended to 2,467 World War II veterans in Los Angeles county for the purchase of farms and homes, the State Department of Veterans Affairs announced today.

For the State as a whole, 6,447 World War II veterans obtained property under the California Farm and Home Purchase Act during the period January 1, 1944, to July 1, 1947. The total amount advanced by the State to these veterans was \$25,448,677.
