Torrance School Health Program Outlined By Superintendent Hull

Placing emphasis on positive health in the program rather than upon a school nursing program, Superintendent of Schools J. Henrich Hull outlined the Torrance thealth program last week. In a memorandum to the factulty of Torrance City Schools, Hull listed four criteria for establishing an adequate school health

Hull listed four criteria for esta program. (1) Special services to the school child which help to both determine and meet his health needs. (2) Health instruction in the classroom. lishing an adequate school health teacher has opportunity to in-the control of the school curriculum. Parents are advised that exam-inations of children are not com-pulsory. Section 16483 of the Education Code reads: "A par-or charge of any child enrolled in the public schools may file annually with the principal of the school in which he is en-rolled a statement in writing, signed by the parent or guar-dian, stating that he will not consent to the physical examina-tion of his child. Thereupon the school he exampt from any physical examination, but when-sever there is a good reason to believe that the child is suffer-ing from arecognized contagious or infectious disease, he shall be sent home and shall not be per-mitted to return until school au-thorities are satisfied that any contagious or infectious disease

(2) Health instruction in the classroom.
(3) Maintenance of a safe and healthful school environment.
(4) Active development of home and community relationships in relation to the school health program. Close cooperation between nurse and teacher through frequent conferences is stressed in the program. The function of the nurse ln relation to the criteria may be summed up as follows:

The function of the nurse in relation to the criteria may be summed up as follows: Rendering special services to the .child through observation, examination, testing, study of ehild's health history and ad-vice to child and parents toward correct medical care. As consultant and advisor to the teacher in classroom health instruction: Protecting the health of the child through maintenance of safe and healthful school environ-ment, i.e., lunch programs, sani-tary and safe school environ-ment, establishmeut of policies for handling emergency illnesses, accidents and first aid. Development of home and com-munity relationships in relation to the school health program. Company Given Rate Increase

Kate Increase The state public utilities com-mission has authorized the Do-minguez Water Corp. to increase its rates in the 26-square-mile area it serves in Torranee and east of Torranee. New rate minimum for domes-tic and commercial users on quantity is \$1 for the first 500 cu bic feet with the minimum meter charge \$1 per month for three-fourths inch meters or smaller. For irrigation, the minimum by quantity is seven cents per 100 cubic feet with a \$1 mini-mum for all meters. The rate increase, effective Sept. 1, is expected to increase the corporation's revenue by \$85, 000 a year. The area served by the con-

Sept. 1. The corporation's revenue by \$55, 000 a year. The area served by the cor-poration is between Redondo Beach and the Los Angeles river.
