

Kindergarten Requirements Of Los Angeles City Schools Are Revealed

More than 20,000 youngsters are expected in approximately 400 kindergarten classes throughout Los Angeles City School district when school reopens on Sept. 15, according to Dr. Raymond Pollich, assistant superintendent of elementary schools in Los Angeles. The district includes Lomita, Harbor City and the Shoestring Strip area.

"Due to the high birth rate of the past 10 years," said Dr. Pollich, "the schools are faced with a tremendous problem in providing housing space for all of the children of elementary school age—especially those between the ages of 4 1/2 and 6 years who are eligible for kindergarten.

"According to state law," stated Pollich, "a child must be 4 1/2 years of age on or before Sept. 15, 1947, to enroll in kindergarten. This means he or she must be five years of age on or before March 1, 1948."

As soon as schools open on Monday, Sept. 15, at 8:00 a. m., kindergarten enrollment will begin, explained the school official, and will continue thereafter until classes are filled. When the maximum enrollment has been attained, children will be registered on waiting lists. As soon as vacancies occur, thereafter, children will be enrolled in classes in the order in which their names appear on the waiting lists. The state law is very specific on this point of first come first served. In other words, age does not in any way entitle the child to priority.

Board of Education regulations require that parents enrolling children in kindergarten (or first grade) for the first time are required to present a birth certificate or certain other documents of proof of age. Whatever the document, it must contain of the date, month and year of the

child's birth. The following are acceptable as proof of birth.

1. Birth certificate.
2. Health office or vital statistics record of birth date.
3. Affidavit of physician attending birth or hospital record of birth.
4. U. S. Census Bureau (Washington, D.C.) record.
5. Court decree establishing date and place of birth.
6. Entry in family Bible of record of birth, baptismal or other church record.
7. Adoption papers.
8. Passport.
9. Insurance policy over two years old.

Dr. Pollich emphasized the fact that no kindergarten enrollments will be accepted prior to 8:00 a. m. on Sept. 15, 1947.
