trustees and with the understanding that unification would take
place so that Torrance could take
over the high school in 1948,
voted 10 to one in favor of Redondo.

All preparations of the Redondo trustees for operation of the high school have been in close harmony with the Torran ce Board of Education, and the switch from Redondo to Torrance control of the high school will be accomplished after the unification without the dishammony which marked the withdrawal from Los Angeles, it is said.

Torrance more than doubled the Redondo assessed valuation for school purposes this year, and it is in this manner, and in receiving the state school support funds next year, that Redondo is being paid for operation of the high school here.
