

Dirty Seven Lose Practice Game

The Dirty Seven, last year's Golden for six points or the third Torrance champions, had their first workout of the season last Sunday at the high school field.

The short session was followed by a practice game with the fast Sachs and Sons Ford dealer team from Downey. The practice tilt was won by the visitors, 19 to 14, in the last three minutes of play on a long pass.

The winners led at the half, 13-0, after an interception of Bob Golden's pass intended for Ralph George went for a touchdown and conversion in the first quarter and another TD was added in the second period when a Downey player scored after stealing the ball from Golden's hands as he was about to pass.

The local boys came back early in the third quarter when Eddie Roberts took a long pass from

Golden for six points or the third play of the period. The same two players teamed up for the extra point.

Following the kickoff, the Dirty Seven regained possession of the ball on an interception and scored again on a lateral from Golden to Paul Biller, who flipped to Leroy Schwenk in the end zone. A short pass from Golden to Dan Moon for the conversion put the Torrance boys into the lead, 14-13.

The score remained at 14-13 until, with only three minutes left in the game, a long Downey pass bounced off the intended receiver's hands, over the outstretched hands of Torrance's Biller, and into the arms of the second Downey player who went over for the deciding tally.

Torrance B Grid Team Ready For Opening Tilt

The Torrance B football squad, with three weeks of hard practicing behind it, is rounding into shape for its opening game against Redondo a week from today at the Torrance High field.

Coached by Cliff Greybehl, the B team has been concentrating on blocking and tackling. Greybehl has 40 men out for the team and the boys have been working hard in preparation for its full-length scrimmage against the third string varsity this week.

With only two lettermen returning from last year's team that copied second place in the Marine league, the B's are hurt most by inexperience. The lack of know-how is made up by a fighting spirit that enabled the little men to throw varsity runners for losses several times during scrimmage sessions. Led by the two returning monogram winners, Don Bodner at right guard and Bob Snuffer at left half, Greybehl's squad has been running their plays from the straight single wing formation rather than the more popular "T."

Although the line-up for the Redondo opener is not definite, Greybehl has been working a first string of Jack Dean and Jack Stevens at the ends, Yovan Popovich and Dick Ferguson at tackle, Don Bingham and Bodner at the guards and Ray Maddock at center.

Leading the B backfield at quarterback is Jerry Wetzel. Dick Cloward has been running from the fullback spot and Ralph Standridge at right half, with Snuffer and Boyd Crawford alternating at the left half post.

However, Coach Greybehl is looking for a lot of good playing from his reserves and will promote them to the first team whenever the boys on top let down just the least bit.

One of the hardest playing lads fighting for a first team berth is little Lokie Takai. Takai won his letter with the Redondo B's last year at guard but Greybehl has shifted him to the blocking-back position.

Other backs who are threatening to crack into the line-up are Leroy Sweigert at left half; Phil Wall, full; and Chuck Voorhees, quarterback. Promising second team linemen are Dave Doherty at right end and Charlie Begue at guard.

The B schedule is exactly opposite from the varsity, with the B's playing the B squad from the school that the varsity is meeting. The B's will play at home when the varsity plays away and away when the varsity plays at home, with all the B games to be played on Thursday afternoons. The home field will be the Torrance High field in the rear of the school.
