Water Rates For Irrigation Are Raised By City

Water rates for irrigation were raised by the three Torrance Municipal Water districts, through action of the City Council Tuesday night.

A series of resolutions and one ordinance was adopted, which provide that irrigation water users pay seven cents per 100 cubic feet for all water used more than 2,000 cubic feet. The old rate is five cents. The rate for the first 2,000 cubic feet remains the same, \$2.32.

Meter installation charges also were increased, a five-eighths by three-quarter inch installation being raised to \$15 from \$12.50. Others were increased in similar proportions.

Superintendent William Stanger said that other water companies raised their rates for irrigation water to 10 cents per 100 cubic feet, and that the Bureau of Power and Light of Los Angeles is charging \$35 for installation of a five-eighths by three-quarters meter.

"Our rates are second lowest in the County of Los Angeles, the lowest being Arcadia," Stanger declared.

Mechling Ends Services Here

For 16 years pastor of the Torrance Lutheran church, the Rev. Frank D. Mechling will deliver his last sermon here Sunday morning.

Rev. Mechling is resigning to return to Ohio to visit relatives and rest. His successor at the Lutheran church has not yet been announced.

The Rev. Paul Moore Wheeler also resigned recently to leave his post as rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal church for Newport Beach.
