## SCHOOLS UNIFICATION UP R. E. McCaffrey, FOR VOTE ON JANUARY 23

Torrance voters will be asked on Jan. 23, 1948, to pass upon the question of unification of all Torrance schools under one administration, Board of Education and taxpaying district.

The election to bring about the break of Torrance high school from Redondo Union High School District tentatively has been set for that date, according to Superintendent of Schools J. Henrich Hull.

Unification means, it was pointed out, that all schools from kindergarten to high school will be under the jurisdiction of one board of education, one administration, with a single tax rate, thus assuring elimination of duplication and a well-defined education, and Torrance placed Redondo Beach, rather than remaining with Los Angeles, by a vote cational program through all grades. When Torrance City School District was formed, under the provisions of the new City Charter and the Education Code, it was necessary for the district to affiliate with an adjoining high school district for secondary education, and Torrance picked Redondo Beach, rather than remaining with Los Angeles, by a vote of 12 to 1.
