State Aid For School Funds UP 64 Percent

Los Angeles County school districts will get \$60,894.98 in state aid for the 1947-48 school year. These figures were announced in an interview with Dr. C. C. Trillingham, county superintend ent of schools, who indicated that this amount of state aid is an increase of 64.67 percent over last year.

Dr. Trillingham explained that the increase in the apportionmen of state funds to the local school districts is due to four causes:
