

EL CAMINO PLANS FOR PERMANENT CAMPUS

Plans for the permanent buildings of El Camino college now are in the hands of architects and engineers, and they will be laid out on the 90-acre Alondra Park campus in such a way as to utilize the temporary buildings as long as they are needed, President Forrest G. Murdock, of the college, told the Torrance Herald this week.

The temporary buildings now being reconstructed from Army Air Force "H" type barracks structures are being placed on permanent foundations and they will serve for years to come, if necessary," President Murdock said.

"However, we are planning to build some temporary buildings to take care of the present enrollment and that contemplated in the next semester, but they will all be placed so that the development of the permanent campus can proceed without interference."

He said that the Army buildings now being reconstructed for use at the start of the next semester will form an "H" on the Redondo Beach boulevard side of the campus. The new temporary structures will be erected immediately to the west, facing Torrance on Redondo Beach Blvd. They will occupy space which will be used for parking as soon as the stadium is constructed by the college, according to Murdock. This will not come, however, until per-

manent classroom buildings are constructed.

Plans for the Army buildings call for 17 classrooms, one of office, library, snack room, student store, store-room and facilities. The new temporary buildings will add from 13 to 14 classrooms and will be of complementary design. They will include faculty rooms.

Enrollment has already passed 1,100 students and may approach 2,000 when daytime classes are started next semester. The classes now are being held afternoons and evenings at Leuzinger high school.

The County of Los Angeles will aid in constructing the athletic and recreation plant on Alondra Park as a part of the deal by which the college was granted the site on the county park land by the Board of Supervisors. All money paid by the college district for the land will be returned in recreation and athletic facilities by the county.

This action was taken by the board last week when the Los Angeles Motor Transit company was granted permission to extend its lines on Western ave. to take in the area formerly served by the Gardena buses. Dedicate Aqueduct To San Diego

Completion of the San Diego Aqueduct early in December will climax years of effort to assure a supplemental supply of water urgently needed to meet the increasing demands of a fast-growing community, as well as the vast Naval establishment within its environs.

The additional supply, 50,000,000 gallons daily, will come from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, the diversion point being near the San Jacinto tunnel, in Riverside county. From here the aqueduct will deliver Colorado river water 71 miles to San Vicente reservoir, a unit of the Municipal Water System, for distribution to four communities, including San Diego, and three irrigation districts.

Invitations to participate in the dedication of the aqueduct, which has been set for Dec. 11, have been sent to James Forester, Secretary for Defense; James Krug, Secretary of the Interior; Rear Adm. John J. Manning, chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks; Gov. Earl Warren, U. S. Senators William Knowland and Sheridan Downey, and California Congressmen. The aqueduct was begun in 1945 as an emergency project.
