KEEP GAS BILL DOWN

The Medical Center built by Drs. Clifford Easley and John W. Becman, will also house the offices of Drs. Howard A. Wood, Kirk Garretson, Wendell Hyatt and Eugene Loopesko. Construction of the third and final unit of the Center has begun and is progressing satisfactorily, according to Dr. Easley.

The Center when completed will have reception rooms, business and consultation offices, x-ray and laboratory facilities, examination rooms, muscle training and infant treatment facilities besides other features. One unit will be used exclusively for treatment of industrial accidents and emergency cases.

A professional pharmacy, operated by Carl Scott, will be open for public patronage. Parking space for patrons will also be provided.

The professional office building being built at a cost of \$18,000 at 1617-21 Cravens ave. by Dr. Don C. Moshos is expected to be finished by about Dec. 15, with Dr. Moshos expecting to be in the building sometime around Christmas.

Occupying the building along with Dr. Moshos will be the law firm of Boaz and Lessen, with provision made for another doctor's office to be occupied some time in the future.

Among the facilities will be laboratory and x-ray facilities, examination rooms, facilities for minor surgery, and an eye, ear, nose and throat clinic.

Dr. Rollin R. Smith stated that he expected to be occupying his new \$18,000 animal hospital at 1555 Torrance blvd. on or about Dec. 15, the approximate completion date.

His hospital will have x-ray and laboratory facilities for complete veterinary service. Besides boarding kennels and animal wards, there will also be a "beauty shop" for cats and dogs offering grooming, bathing and other services.

NEW FOSTERS BUILDING NEAR COMPLETION

Construction is nearing completion on a concrete block building of just west of the California State Employment Service office which will be occupied by a Fosters Old Fashioned Freeze store.

William Hartley, of Des Moines, is the lessee of the building which will be one of some 40 units now operating or following news of the Angeles County by Fosters, according to C. Earl Conner, who owns the land and who is constructing the building for Hartley.

The lot and building represents an investment of \$20,000, according to Conner. It is located on a lot 88 by 180 feet in size.
