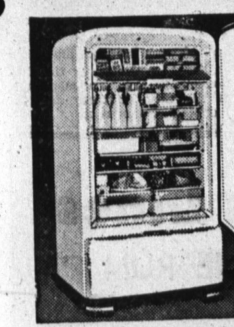

**Four More Clubs Donate To Fund For Audiometer**

Only \$80 remain to be collected to reach the \$285 goal required to buy a Malco audiometer, hearing testing device needed by Torrance City schools, Mrs. Gertrude Boyle of the American Legion Auxiliary which is sponsoring the drive announced this week.

"We'd like to purchase the audiometer for a Christmas present," Mrs. Boyle said, "so we're asking that all organizations planning to contribute send their donations in to 1225 Acacia ave. as soon as possible."

Four new donors have been added to the list: Torrance High School P.T.A., \$10; Women's Benefit Association, \$10; Rotary Club, \$15 and Torrance Woman's Club \$10.

Other contributors have been the American Legion, \$25; the Legion Auxiliary, \$25; Torrance Elementary P.T.A., \$10; St. Cecilia's Guild, \$10; To-Lo-Ha Club, \$10; Perry School P.T.A., \$20; National Business and Professional Women's Club, \$10; Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary, \$10; Fern Avenue School P.T.A., \$10; Women of the Moose, \$5 and the Lions Club \$25.

Any money received over the amount needed will be used for improvements in Torrance City schools, Mrs. Boyle said.

The audiometer is a Malco simplified school model, portable, and gives accurate determination of qualitative as well as quantitative hearing loss. Children who have been tested with this device will become eligible for treatment at the San Pedro clinic.

A school nurse first told civic-minded citizens of the need for the audiometer, and the drive to provide funds then was taken up by the Auxiliary.

**Oratorio To Be Sung**

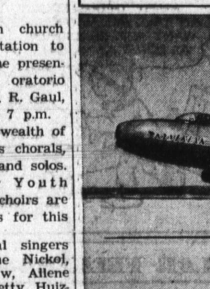

**Pigeon Season Warning Given**

With the opening of the band-tailed pigeon hunting season throughout California on Dec. 1, the Division of Fish and Game reminds hunters that while pigeon shooting is illegal after sunset, game is extended from one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

Open season on pigeons, quail, rabbits and tree squirrels closes Dec. 31. Plugged guns holding no more than three shells are required. Bag limits for band-tailed pigeon are 10 per day and 10 in possession.
