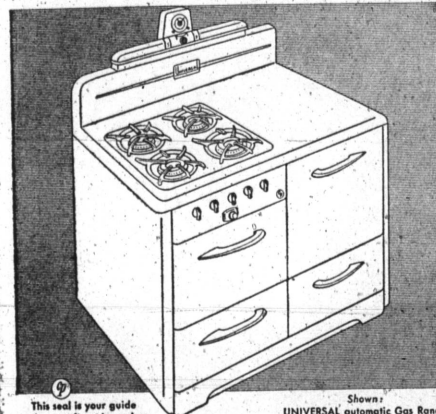

O.R.C. AND N.G. OFFICERS GIVEN NEW STAFF DUTY

General Mark W. Clark, commanding general of the Sixth Army, has announced the initiation of a system whereby his general staff will include at all times one Reserve officer and one National Guard officer. This is the first time that such a measure has been adopted by any of the six armies. The move is being made in order to bring about a more effective unification of the Regular army and the civilian components in the Sixth Army area. The eight states in the area will be represented in rotation on General Clark's staff.

Second Term At Palos Verdes To Start Feb. 9

Palos Verdes College, new two-year coeducational college in the Rolling Hills section of the Palos Verdes peninsula, has announced that plans for second semester enrollment are now being completed.

A special catalogue, listing courses open to entering freshmen and to transfer students, and an illustrated folder of the new institution have been published.

Registration for the second semester is scheduled for Feb. 9. Numerous inquiries have been received already, and interviews with prospective students are taking place, according to Dr. Richard P. Saunders, president.

A complete, two-year course in liberal arts, business administration, drama and music is being offered to both resident and day students who wish to enter the new institution at mid-semester.

The college, with a small student body and a fine faculty, emphasizes small classes and individual attention. A strong student government insures student participation in democratic practices and procedure.

The college campus, a modern attractive plant converted from an AAF base at a cost of \$50,000 includes dormitories for men and women students, classrooms, a dining and recreation hall, and a library.

Few War Widows Take Advantage Of Education

Only one out of twenty-five war widows is receiving the educational assistance to which they are entitled, advises J. G. Caldwell, director of the Torrance Area Veterans Service Center.

To increase their earning capacity by acquiring new skills, the California Veterans Dependents Educational Act allows war widows who have not remarried and are state residents up to four years of educational assistance. They receive forty dollars per month to attend college or trade school and twenty dollars for high school level attendance.

Through the State Division of Educational Assistance, children of World War I and II dead are also eligible for educational benefits if 16 to 21 years of age. If enrolled prior to 21, they may receive assistance until the training is complete or until the age of 27, whichever occurs first.

SALVATION ARMY ASKS FOR ADDED YULE DONATIONS

Lieut. Colonel Russell E. Clarke, divisional commander of the Salvation Army, states that applications for assistance by needy families have increased almost 30 per cent this year, whereas income from the Salvation Army's street-corner trippots at Christmas time have decreased 25 per cent.

Asking for added support, Clarke said that checks may be mailed to the Salvation Army Christmas fund, 832 W. 9th st., Los Angeles, or contributions placed in the "boiling pots" on city street corners.
