City Bus Line to Make Rose Parade Trips

Local residents desiring bus transportation to the Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day may reserve passage — and also a grandstand seat — through the Torrance Municipal Bus Lines office.

Marshal Chamberlain, superintendent said that the round trip fare on the municipal buses would be \$2.50 and that the reserved grandstand seats would cost \$5 additional, or a total of \$7.50.

Buses will leave from the Torrance City Hall at 6:30 a.m., and will return immediately following the end of the parade, or about 1:30 o'clock, he estimated.
