

### Seek Ruling on Cemetery

is to dedicate a cemetery and inter bodies in compliance with the technical requirements of the state code, without going to any state authority for permission. This they claim, would allow a flood of cemeteries of all types to be dedicated in any city irrespective of the desires of residents or officials of the city.

"Most of the cities and counties of California have for years had zoning laws in effect and have enforced them. The State Health and Safety Code pertaining to cemeteries likewise has been in effect for many years.

"The offices of the Los Angeles City Attorney and the Los Angeles County Counsel, when contacted on the matter, pointed to the practices in effect in both that city and the county and which, it is contended, are absolutely opposite to the result which would obtain should the Torrance City Attorney's opinion be correct."

Background of the controversy is a permit granted Senness by the Torrance City Planning Commission on Nov. 24 for a zoning variance on the cemetery. As a result of opposition by owners of property adjoining and near the proposed project, the Torrance City Council set Dec. 21 for a hearing on the proposal.

Then, the City Attorney rendered the aforementioned opinion. Since that time, those who have protested the project have been investigating the law on the subject.

Among the protestors is the Palos Verdes Corporation, owner-developer of several residential tracts in the area.

### Final Clifton Heights Zone Hearing Set

Property owners in the unincorporated "island" at the south-westerly corner of Torrance are urged to attend the second and final hearing on the proposed zoning plan for the area, known as Clifton Heights, which will be held at the offices of the County Regional Planning Commission on Friday of next week, Dec. 17.

The general reaction to the first hearing and explanation of the proposed zoning was that it was satisfactory. The "L"-shaped area, as yet unzoned, is surrounded by the cities of Torrance and Redondo Beach.

### Annex Solves Space Problem at Postoffice

A Christmas parcel post annex for sorting incoming parcels has been opened by the postoffice department in Harvel's service station, with the entrance off the alley that serves the postoffice.

Postmaster C. E. Conner said that lack of space in the present building made it necessary to have additional space for the Christmas rush outside the building.

The location selected, permits mail sacks from the mobile postoffice to be unloaded directly in front of the annex.
