YOUR BILL OF RIGHTS

One hundred and fifty-seven years ago this week (Dec. 15, 1791) the Bill of Rights—those first ten amendments to the Constitution of the United States—became law.

Are you familiar with these amendments? Here they are briefly:

Art. 1.—Guarantees freedom of religion, of speech, of the press and the right of petition.

Art. II.—Establishes right of people to keep and bear

Art. III.—Specifies when and how soldiers may be quar-

tered in private homes.

Art IV.—Protects against search or seizure of private

property without a warrant.

Art. V.—Provides for due process of law in pro-Art. V.—Provides for due process of law in prosecution for a crime; prevents an accused person from being put in jeopardy twice on the same charge; exempts an accused from testifying against himself; requires compensation to owner when property taken for public use.

Art. VI.—Establishes the right of an accused person to a speedy public trial before an impartial jury.

Art. VII.—Gives the right to a trial by jury in common law cases in which the controversy exceeds \$20.

Art. VIII.—Prohibits excessive ball, fines or cruel punishment.

Art. IX.—Deals with rights retained by the people, no
