Some 350 persons will take part in the community-wide Christmas program. The first part will open with presentation of "The Nativity," a Christmas carol service written eepeclally for orchestra and mixed voices by Staniey Effinger.

Instrumental groups will be fdirected by Abe Mitstein, and the choral groups by George Zavislan. Assisting in the stage setting, costumes and tableau will be Frank Juleff of the drama department, and Miss Elaine Crowe of the art department.

Part II of the concert will consist of less familiar Christmas chorals and a finale in which everyone may take part. The concert is free, although people are asked to bring an article—a jar of jelly, canned goods or anything that can be turned over later to the city for distribution to needy children during the Christmas holidays. A capacity crowd is expected.

College Votes Contract for

Trustees of El Camino College last night leafed through a crowded agenda to award additional contracts for the construction of permanent buildings on the Alondra Park site.

First item was the contract for construction of the women's gymasium, awarded to the West and Douglass Construction Co. of Passadena on a low bid of \$235,089.

A second contract was awarded for the expansion of the present administration building to the Brewer-Webb Construction Co. of Long Beach.

The board also approved the grading of the athletic field on the west side of the campus to the Freed McKinley Co. of Paramount on a bid of \$11.489.35. Thirteen companies bid on the contract.

On the advice of civil engineer Harold Barnett of Pasadena, the board. awarded a contract for supplying 74,000 cubic yards of fill material for the stadium embankment to the C. and M. Contracting Co. of Manhattan Beach. The low bid was \$38,976.50 as compared to a high bid of \$104.
