Capital investment in Los An-geles county industry since 1941 amounts to about 835,000,000, according to the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce. chamber of Commerce. "Of this amount," the Cham ber said; "\$510,000,000 was in vested in the expansion of 2860 industries. The balance, \$252,000, 000 was spent in establishing 1480 new plants. The investment for 1948 is still an estimated figure.

cd as one of the most amaz-ing economic developments in history. "Payrolls since the 1939 census have risen by 345.2 per cent," the Chamber said. "In 1939, the census placed the Los Angeles county payrolls at \$166,680,167. Taxes and deductions for such purposes of social security of course have taken geometrically increased percentage of gross payrolls; but even so the mean-ing of this payroll increase for purchasing power is breath-taking.

ing of this payroll increase for purchasing power is breath-taking. According to "Sales Manage-remet," retail sales in the county increased from 1,314,-t 497,000 in 1937 to 8,4622,519 in t 1937. A considerable part of this increase, of course, is ac-counted for by increased prices. But even if it is as-sumed that prices have tripled. the consumer's position still is improved by at least 25 per cent. The probable expansion of the tax base, moreover, is appalling. More than one nation operates on less taxes than are paid by Los Angeles county.

Post Avenue, Torrance. The buttons are available without cost to those defined as "next of kin." This term in cludes widowe, mother, father, step-mother.


