

### COLORADO RIVER WATER PROSPECTS FOR 1949

Will 1949 be the year of decision on the hotly disputed claims of California and Arizona to water from the Colo-rado river?

claims of California and Arizona to water from the Colorado river?

That question directly concerns the welfare and for tunes of \$500,000 citizens living in the 28 Southern California cities, including Torrance, that have joined the Metropolitan Water District in order to supplement fast dwindling local water supplies.

But more important than the monetary obligation is the question of water supply. The various public agencies serving Colorado River water to homes, industries and farms hold contracts with the government for a total of \$530,000.

In the face of this condition, Arizona is now using and has authorized projects that will use a total of \$300,000.

In the face of this condition, Arizona interests are asking Congress to give them a \$738,000,000 handout in the ferm of a costly irrigation project. Water for their speculative land development scheme could be had only by taking away some of California's contract water. The people and the industries and farms of California need their full share. There is no other economic source to which they can turn for water.

That is why public officials who are responsible for water supplies in Southern California look to 1949 to bring an end to the controversy that has dragged on for 2 years.
