Sewer Costs in Shoestring to Be Heard

Shoestring addition residents in the vicinity of Redondo Beach boulevard will be given an opportunity to protest on March 2 against construction of sanitary sewers in their area.

The Los Angeles City Council set the hearing date in adopting an ordinance of intention for the improvement of the boulevard from Figueroa street to Vermont avenue. Residents of the area who benefit from the improvement will pay all costs.

Dr. George H. Uhl, city health officer, recommended the project to the city council as a "necessary health measure."

"Soil (in the area) is unsatisfactory for private sewage disposal installations and all residents are experiencing considerable difficulty with over-flowing cesspools," Dr. Uhl reported.

Phillips Brooks Joins Medical Staff at USC

Dr. Phillips M. Brooks of Torrance now is an official member of the School of Medicine faculty, University of Southern California, Dec. 20, as a research associate in aviation medicine.

Before coming to SC to work with Dr. Charles Lombard in the studies of the stresses and strains a modern pilot must endure, Dr. Brooks was a professor at Riverside College in philosophy and physiology.

Dr. Brooks was a member of the second group of scientists to re-survive Bikini in 1947. During the war he was engaged in aviation medicine research at Wright Field, Dayton. He received his A.B. degree from the University of California (Berkeley) and his Ph.D. at Stanford University.

Contract Let for Grading of Playfield

Grading of the playfield at El Camino College was under way this week, following award of a contract to Fred McKinley for his low bid of \$11,480. The bid was considerably under the engineer's estimate of \$13,000 for the work.

The project involves the removal of the landmark familiarly known as "Mt. Wimmer," containing an estimated 16,500 cubic yards of earth piled up several years ago to await the need of it. Some 8,000 cubic yards of sand and nearly 10,000 cubic yards of adobe will be excavated and spread in the grading operations.

Twelve other bids were received, ranging up to \$25,222.

Construction of a frame and siding addition to the college office building also is under way this week at a cost of \$2650.

A. J. Stoddard, superintendent of Los Angeles city schools, recommended today that the Board of Education condemn property for a new elementary school site near Wilmington.

Stoddard said the property is located at the northeast corner of 213th street and Water street, consisting of about five acres.

Until officially named the proposed facility will be known as the Del Amo School. The board will act on the recommendation soon.

Will of Rea, Suicide, Filed for Probate

The eleventh-hour penciled will and testament of the late William W. Rea, who took his own life in a small industrial plant adjacent to Torrance on Christmas Eve, has been filed for probate in Los Angeles county superior court by Joseph V. Russell, acting in behalf of the widow, Mrs. Ruth B. Rea.

The husband bequeathed his wife "three quarts of wine a week" from his estate, valued at \$23,250, according to the petition. The will orders all of the estate to be distributed equally among Rea's three minor children.
