## Here in Danger of 'Drying Up'

Torrance and Lo: ita property owners were advised today that Arizona's renewed attempts to promote the huge Central Atizona Profect in the halls of Congress may "dry up" a water supply which could support an additional five million Southern Californians, according to Ben P. Griffith, secretary of the Colorado River Association.

"The various public agencies serving Colorado River water to homes, industries and Carns, hold contracts with the Government for a total -of -5,302-000 acre feet of water annually. Arizona is now using and has authorized projects which will use 3,300,000 acre feet, Griffith said.
