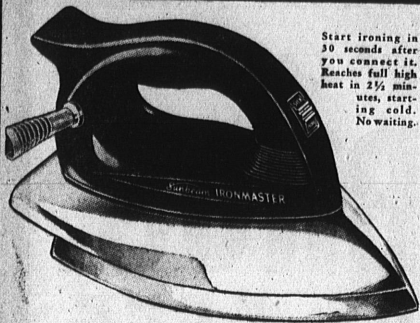

Bleachers at School Ready by Feb. 26

A 15-day extension for completion of the bleachers contract at Torrance High School was allowed this week by the Board of Education. The contractor, C. B. Bagnall of Torrance, has been delayed by rainy weather. The new completion date now is Feb. 26.

The Board also approved two minor changes in the bleacher contract this week, for relocation of ticket booths and Torrance work at an additional cost of \$200. Total amount of the bleacher contract now stands at \$57,065.

Purchase of 400 new padlocks for all the school grounds was approved by the board, at a cost of \$1.95 each, or \$780 for the lot. The bid of the Torrance Cycle and Fix-it Shop was accepted, because of the shortest delivery time, although Emmett Ingram, business manager, said he had received identical bids from the several firms who bid on the locks.

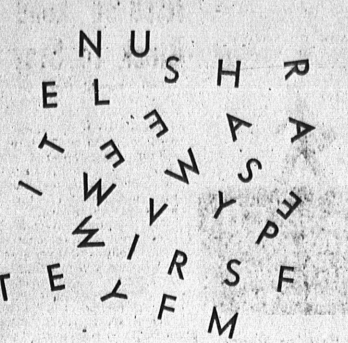
AT DISTRICT MEET
