Sunday Service Topic Set for Science Church

"Are Sin, Disease, and Death Real?" This question will be the Sunday Lesson-Sermon subject Sunday at The First Church of Christ, Scientist here.

The Golden Text is from Psalms: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thine diseases; who redeemeth thy life from destruction."

"The universal belief in death is of no advantage," writes Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." Again she says, "The Christian Scientist has enlisted to lessen evil, disease, and death; and he will overcome them by understanding their nothingness and the aliveness of God, or good."
