Women of Torrance Hear Challenge of Princess

A challenge to the women of Torrance to widen their horizons to include people of different racial and nationality backgrounds was given by Ataloo, the attractive American Indian princess, at the National YWCA Week observance in Torrance last week. Drawing her illustrations from a variety of minority group situations in the United States and other parts of the world, Ataloo made a sincere and dramatic appeal for broader understanding.

Ataloo related that, at the instigation of a woman who felt strongly that war was unnecessary, a group of five Indian nations formed the first United Nations in America many years ago. Women today, banded together in the world-wide YWCA, can take in leadership in the building of a peaceful world. YWCA is truly "your window to the world."

Mr. George Zavislan, Torrance High School music director, presented the high school a capella choir in a group of songs. Mrs. A. E. Palmer, chairman of the Torrance YWCA Committee, introduced the speaker and program. Coffee and tea were served from a graciously appointed table presided over by Mrs. John Van Cleve Morris and Mrs. Ben J. Hostmark, both YWCA staff members. Woman's clubhouses was decorated for the occasion with flowers in YWCA colors, blue and white.

C. E. Guild Meeting Set for May 11

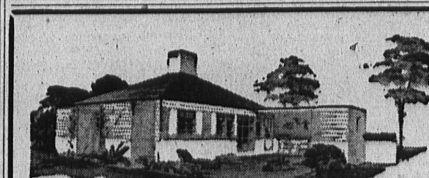

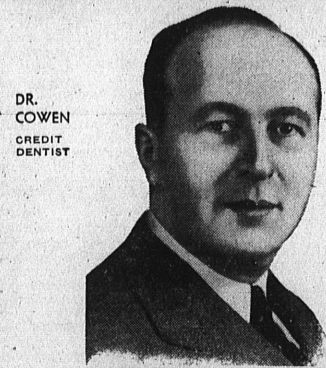
