**A FRIEND IN NEED--IS THE WELFARE CENTER**

It still happens here! Recently a school principal wondered why Johnny was not attending school. He asked a lady from the PTA to visit the family to find out why. When she arrived she found that the father was out of work and bringing in no money. There was no food in the house and the children had no shoes. She didn't know where to send them for help. Many people are asking, "Where can I turn for help in an emergency. How do I find the right welfare, health or recreation service when I need it?"

The Community Chest maintains the Torrance District Welfare Center at 1339 Post avenue.

Anyone wanting information of this kind can receive it by simply going in and asking, or by telephoning, Torrance 1356. A file of health, welfare and recreation services is kept to provide the speediest possible referral to the right place.

Also in the Welfare Center are representatives of several Community Chest agencies and the Y.M.C.A. (represented by Milton Isbell). The Community Chest agencies are: The Veteran's Service Center, represented by Miss Helen Dill; Family Service, represented by Miss Rebecca Tuck; Catholic Welfare Bureau, Miss Betty Troost; Y.W.C.A., Mrs. Elaine Hostmark; Girl Scouts, Miss Sylvia Lenham. Mrs. Mabelle Patton, and Mrs. Bernice Boone operate the Center.

pride is the Pueblo Center, a Community Chest neighborhood center operated by the Catholic Youth Organization in North Torrance. The Pueblo Center was established through the cooperative efforts of many people as a result of discussions initiated by the Welfare Council because there was a need for that service.

The Council, whose chairman is Reverend Torben Olsen of the St. Andrews Episcopal Church, is here to bring about a better total program of welfare, health and recreation services for this area. If there is a need for a service which is not being fulfilled, the council calls together representatives of groups which might do something about it. Through democratic discussion, cooperative plans are worked out to fill the need, making the most efficient possible use of existing organizations.

The Council also stands ready to offer its services to help coordinate programs to avoid duplication, waste and overlapping. A council committee is now engaged in studying recreation needs and plans.

The next meeting of the Welfare Council will be at noon, Tuesday, May 17th, at Daniels Cafe, 1625 Cabrillo avenue. Cecil Feldman, Director of Associated Cities Department of the Welfare Federation of Los Angeles, will speak on the "Purpose and Function of Welfare Councils." The public is invited. Lunch is \$1.10.
